Friday Night Soup Run

Well it's not just a soup run. As you can see in the picture we specialise in giving out clothing as well as hot drinks, sandwiches, soup and fresh fruit.



The Soup Run goes out most Friday evenings returning at about midnight. We pick up extra volunteers on our way to two regular

The Welfare Department

The Welfare is run by a community volunteer, Norma Lewis, with three helpers.

Most help is needed by mothers with young children for basic clothing, bedding, and even pushchairs and toys. It is



very busy at present handing out hundreds of items each month. The Welfare Department operates on donations from many different sources and often finds that special items turn up providentially just when needed.

Messy Church

Our Messy Church is part of a phenomenon that is sweeping the world. It is such a great way to feel involved with Christianity without the boring bits (sorry, preachers everywhere) and the kids love it (aged 0-13yr). Messy church involves crafts, play, action songs and bible stories. Plus the shared meal is always a great attraction!



All this is provided free for visitors. Up to 250 people have been coming so booking is essential.

Toddler Club

Always a favourite, the Toddler Club is provided as a service to the community. The club operates

three session per week: two on Wednesday and one on Thursday morning. Spaces are very limited, so prior booking is essential.

Pancake Day Recipe

It's March! This means pancake time!

While looking for a different recipe to try, I came across this one from Doves farm and let me just say this: if my husband liked them, you will definitely like them!



So let's not delay any further and let's get cooking!

Ingredients

| 150 g | Self Raising Flour |
|---------|------------------------|
| 50 g | Buckwheat flour |
| 25 g | Icing Sugar |
| 3 | Eggs |
| 1 tsp | Vanilla Extract |
| 400 ml | Milk |
| 3 tbsps | Sunflower Oil (approx) |

Method

1. Mix together the flour, sugar, baking powder and cinnamon.

2. Grate the orange and squeeze the juice into a measuring jug.

3. Add water until you have 150ml/5floz of liquid (you may not need it all, or slightly more than specified depending on the orange). It also depends on how much orange flavour you like. 4. Mix the egg into the liquid then pour everything into the flour.

5. Stir to make a smooth batter.

6. Lightly oil a heavy frying pan and heat well.

7. Cook until bubbles form and the bottom is

golden, then turn over and cook on the other side. These won't be like the thin crepe type pancakes but still yummy!
