Over the last few days, before Stanborough News went to press, we were listening to reports from the rescue workers who were looking for the missing crew of the yacht Cheeki Rafiki. We listened to family members of the crew

plead for governments to continue the search for their loved ones. Recently we also listened, hoping for some good news about the missing Malaysian flight. Sadly there was none. That news story is no longer newsworthy. It has faded away unresolved, the families of the missing ones still waiting in hope. The news floods us with stories where hope seems to be in vain, but it is surprising how much of our lives we live by hope, and often hope triumphs. Just today the news came of two missing fishermen who were found hours after four lifeboats, two helicopters and a reconnaissance aircraft failed to find any trace of

them and called off the search. The grandfather and grandson survived for two days in their open 16ft boat on two biscuits, a flask of tea and water.

As a community of faith we pray for those who are grieving and hoping, and understand their longing for their hopes to be fulfilled. We don't pretend to understand the enigma of suffering and pain, yet we know that hope in Jesus Christ can give the gift of endurance through such times. Stanborough Park Church

It does not seem long ago since a new building appeared, with a bold but unpretentious look, along the vista of the St. Albans Road in Garston. This was necessitated by the devastating fire to the UK headquarters of our church in November 2008. A few years previously the Stanborough Centre had been added to the church building which also stands in the grounds of Stanborough Park. The Stanborough Centre is a popular venue that has had a positive impact within the local areas and within the church. Now the time has come to bring the church itself up to date.

Built in the 1920s the church is in urgent need to be fully refurbished and equipped for modern life including more comprehensive access for the disabled. Like many other Christian churches we are very focussed on becoming a greater force for good in the whole community and the refurbishment has been designed with that in mind. Necessary planning permission for alterations was sought as far back as 2010 and we are at last within sight of beginning the work hopefully before the next issue of Stanborough News. Most of the work to be done is inside the present building, but there will be modest enlargement to the walls of the choir area which is on the left hand side of the church when viewed from the street. In fact there will be very little visual impact on the exterior of the church. We hope the church can still retain its old nickname of The Church in the Woods.

There is a lot to do and the work may take up to 40 weeks to complete. We can understand that some of our close neighbours will be concerned about how the building works will affect them. To ensure the least possible disturbance we have made it a condition of contract that noise and nuisance are factored in and must be kept to a minimum.



Some very good news is that the Stanborough Centre will function as normal everyday of the week for the whole duration of the building works. So please do continue to participate in the events of the community and the regular lectures, seminars and talks. Also our toddler club will continue as normal.

The biggest impact on us as a faith community of worshippers is that the worship area will be inaccessible for a lengthy period. We plan to provide alternative accommodation in a temporary worship space to be erected on Stanborough Park behind the administrative office block. This location should ensure that church life will carry on with as little as possible disruption to the normal lives of our neighbours.

You are welcome to come and view the building plans which will be on display in the Stanborough Centre once the project has begun. We will also endeavour to keep you up to date via our website, Facebook group and this newsletter. If you would like to contact the Pastoral staff concerning the development project or for any other reason we are more than willing to talk to you. Contact details are on the back of this magazine.
