#### An Invitation Too Good To Miss

**IN LUKE 14,** we find Jesus telling a parable about a dinner while he is eating at the home of a prominent Pharisee. It's interesting to think about the drama and the tensions undoubtedly present there.

In the story, a certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. Amazingly, they started to make excuses why they couldn't attend. If we read them we can easily see that they are phoney excuses.

The master is angry. His gracious invitation has been mocked. To refuse the invitation is to lose it. He orders his servant, Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame......Go out to the roads and country lanes and make them come in, so that my house will be full.

Sometimes the church does not seem to be the place for healing and celebration.

Sometimes we feel like hiding. It's easier not to be there. But I want to encourage you to stay with us. The church family needs you. Together we can make a difference. Let no-one push you out

Someone took the top ten excuses of those who choose not to attend church and inserted "wash" instead of "go to church".

God's banquet has begun. It doesn't begin at the end of time, but NOW. The time is NOW! (love, joy, peace, celebration...) God's banquet has begun in Christ.

God makes the guest list, not us! Who is on the Lord's guest list? (*ALL*, black and white, people with large incomes, people on welfare, married/divorced people, Conservatives and Labour).

God's invitation can be refused.

But why refuse?

If there are any excuses in your life that stop you joining this feast, from coming to this church, then you need to tell us.

- > If you say the church is too cold, I guess Mary, Ian and I might get blankets from our cars and fans for those who say it is too hot.
- > Doctors and nurses will be in attendance for those who plan to be sick service time. They are here every week.
- Perhaps you are waiting for hell to freeze over? It did just that in January 2001. A little town called Hell in Michigan has fewer than 400 people. The river at the dam froze over completely after several weeks of below freezing weather.

Excuses have a price. So the poor, blind and lame are having the time of their lives at the party. What happened to the original invitees? See Luke 14: 24, *I tell you*, *not one of those men who were invited will get a taste of my banquet*.

So my friend let's grab an invitation and see you at the table.

**EXCITING** new research is showing that we are <u>hardwired</u> for compassion, and that compassion and spirituality are closely linked. The Latin root words for compassion mean *to suffer with*. German philosopher Arnold Schopenhauer summarized the concept succinctly, saying, *Compassion is the basis of morality*. Abraham Lincoln epitomized compassion in taking home a drunken, vomit-covered man found lying in the street. He may have had the incident in mind when he said in his inaugural speech: *With malice toward none, with charity for all, with firmness in the right as God gives us the right, let us strive on to finish the work we are in, to bind up the nation's wounds*. Compassion significantly reduces depression and stress and, when practiced consistently, may permanently change our neuro-circuitry. So reaching out to others, and inviting them in, truly exemplifies that giving and receiving bestow enormous benefits all round. Luke, the physician, was ahead of his time (see chapter 6 v 38 for confirmation)!

#### KIT Book Review.

**YOU** must have heard of **Ben Carson**. He is the American, Adventist brain-surgeon who specialises in separating twins joined at the head. You may have read his book, *Gifted Hands*. I haven't but I have read *Take the Risk* - a book brought out in 2008. *Take the Risk* teaches the reader how to identify, choose and live with acceptable risk.

I read about Dr Carson's at-risk childhood in a poor district of Detroit, about his mother who was determined to get the best for her boys, how he coped with the enormous amount of medical knowledge he had to master, how he carried out some of his cases - not all of which were successful.

I found I couldn't put the book down and grew in my respect for a genuine Christian. It's a book well worth reading. Stanborough Press have it and the ABC shop in Watford. It's price is £11.99 and there is an audio version available too. What's more Dr Carson's formula for identifying acceptable risk is easy to understand and use in one's own dilemmas.
