## KIT Editorial - Going to Jerusalem

THE GOSPEL of Matthew is neatly divided into three sections. In his introduction, Matthew sets out to convince his Jewish readers of Jesus Christ's Messiahship. If you like, we could call this section the Person of the King.

The second theme of Matthew is the proclamation of the King. See Matthew 16:21:

**From that time on Jesus began to** explain to His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem And suffer many things at the hands of the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and that He must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.

So we have the **Person**, the **Proclamation** and now the **persecution** (& glorification) of the King.

It is Jesus trying to get through to His uncomprehending disciples that He was going to die, it was part of the divine plan.

How terrible for the Creator of the Worlds, that at long last, the disciples finally have recognised Him as the Messiah; but only on their limited understanding of what the Messiah meant. So besides suffering the agonies to come, He has to re-live it again and again so that their dulled minds could grasp that being the Messiah really meant - going to Jerusalem.

Rejoice with me that the Saviour of the World was not to be deflected. He must go to Jerusalem His mission was clear. He had come to show the world a better way; and to die for your sin and mine. Thank God for Jesus! He was not to be swayed. He was going to die for a purpose, and that was for you and for me.

Let's be very clear: Jesus Christ's death was not an option found in the Plan of Salvation; it was key to it. Without His death there was absolutely no hope. He must go to Jerusalem But this was something alien to the disciples. They had been brought up with the concept of a Messiah with an earthly kingdom, and they had a great deal to gain from being members of the cabinet, the 12 highest ranking officials in this new kingdom Jesus had not come to set up.

**Could** it be that Jesus had no desire to exit the world in a cruel crucifixion? Would it not have been a great temptation to see a political messiahship was a much better option?

Surely the temptation to do His own will by avoiding the Cross was the greatest temptation He had to face daily.

It came to a head in Gethsemane; come with me to Matthew 26:42:

**He went away** a second time and prayed, 'My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to be taken away unless I drink it, may Your will be done.'

What about each one of us? Just because we **follow Jesus** it does not mean we are always on safe ground. Listen to Paul's advice in 1 Corinthians 10:12:

So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!

Here in this story is further challenging news for each one of us, who claims the name of Jesus. Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone would come after Me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me (Matthew 16: 24).

We can only hope to live if we take up the Cross. It may be the very opposite of glamorous, it may be a hard road, it may be a distasteful demand of our Lord.

There was no other way for Jesus, *He must go to Jerusalem*. There is no other way for us. Down through the years, comes the cry of our Saviour: *follow Me* and through His grace, His presence, His example, I can do so. I <u>can</u> follow Him. I can walk hand in hand with Him, be it to a cross and a crown.

How do I achieve this? By following Him to deny myself. I seek to know Him better day by day. I will take Him into me; so that my will becomes His will. my thoughts, His thoughts, my joy secondary to His will.

Why would I do all this? Because, this is the only true path to happiness.

So what of your future? Worldly fame and comparative ease? Or the challenge of the unknown, perhaps the uncomfortable, the pleadings of Him Who *must* go to *Jerusalem*?

How do we respond to His appeal to follow Me?

Are you, prepared, like Him to go to Jerusalem?

#### 'I COULD EAT A HORSE' by Richard J B Willis MA MSc FRSPH

THE HUNGRY souls who have said this, when they have missed a meal, may well have done so over the past little while. Throw in the odd bit of donkey and they have really had a pick-'n'-mix. There is nothing harmful *per se* in eating horse-meat, it is a staple of many cultures. Concerns have been raised about a drug - phenylbutazone - used to treat inflammation in horses. The assurance has been given that vast quantities of contaminated horse-meat would be required to reach even a single, let alone a dangerous, dose of the drug.

There is no room for complacency if you don't eat any of the suspected meat products. The underlying problem is one of truth and purity. Legitimate food 'fraud' is rife when it is understood that even items we may not usually eat are used up to certain defined percentages in foods we might eat, such as pork in other meat products, or the use of GM material where we would not want to use these items. Antibiotics are already eaten through both eggs and chickens as they are used to control salmonella. Even the finest basmati rice is frequently adulterated with inferior rice varieties. So hold your horses. If you want something to beef about then campaign for real food. You can't trust the labels, so trust common sense.

#### NEWS, NEWS, NEWS!


