

Endless Forms Most Beautiful

Did you watch any of the 'Wonders of Life' BBC TV Series? The quotation of Charles Darwin 'Endless Forms Most Beautiful' was an apt description for the third episode. We were treated to a series of the most dazzling photo shots of Nature's best presented by the amazing and lovable Brian Cox, Professor Cox is set to become BBC's new doyen of Natural History after Sir David Attenborough announced this year, "If I had a torch I would hand it to Brian Cox" So far, Brian Cox has treated us to the most amazing descriptions and pictures of some astonishing features of nature, as only the BBC can.

Brian has a way of looking at the most complicated things in nature and making them understandable with a few photographs, and some well-chosen words and a look of wonder and amazement. In this episode he tripped lightly from the amazing formation of carbon atoms in distant space to the amazing structure and generation of DNA, from the progression of carbon atoms in the food chain to a description of all the amazing variety of living things. And finally, what he described as possibly science's greatest discovery: that two random processes, mutations and the environment, can work together to produce all the exquisitely non-random 'endless forms most beautiful'. Just call it 'natural selection'

At each stage of this amazing 'parade of the carbon atom' Brian describes some insuperable obstacle to progress, which is somehow miraculously overcome. Somehow, it all began to look like one simple step too far. Like old cartoons, the hero is doomed but then, miraculously 'with one bound he is free'. The explanation is never forthcoming. By venturing into the realm of natural history Brian has had to rely on overreaching and outdated Darwinian



arguments long relegated to history by the scientific community but that still find favour in the popular media and text books. Brian offers us only 'Proof by Amazement' which, for proper enjoyment, requires a willing suspension of disbelief and wouldn't we do that for Brian? The wonderful glimpses of cosmology are truly amazing and well worth watching but they are best enjoyed and understood in the light of these primeval words[.] 'The heavens tell about the glory of God. The skies announce what his hands have made Each new day tells more of the story, and each night reveals more and more about God's power. You cannot hear them say anything. They don't make any sound we can hear but their message goes throughout the world. Their teaching reaches the ends of the earth. Those words reveal something very satisfying: that we have someone to say 'Thank You' to.
