Christmas is History

Is Christmas outdated? Is Christmas a myth? What is the point of Christmas?

Should we celebrate Christmas?

"History is more or less bunk" said Henry Ford - so maybe you don't need to know any history to get rich making cars. Did you ever watch "Horrible Histories"? Everything that happened before we were born was either funny, stupid or wicked but never boring. It never let the facts get in the way of a good laugh. But I would bet that there is one historical date that everyone is *really* interested in - their own birthday! *You* are history.



Apart from presents, food and fun, birthdays are useful to prove who you are. That's why you've got a birth certificate. If you can't prove you were born you may have a problem getting a passport, opening a bank account, enrolling in a school or university, or even paying your taxes.

Mr Richards had his identity stolen by someone in Germany who owed the German Government £130,000 in taxes. The government kept on demanding that Mr Richards pay

them - he was nearly sent to prison! It got sorted out in the end but last year there were 123,600 cases of Identity Fraud in the UK.

But **Christmas really** *is* **history** and someone is trying to steel its identity. It marks the birthday of a boy called Jesus. All the details were carefully

recorded at the time by many reliable witnesses and the record kept safe ever since. Christmas is true history not like jokey Horrible Histories and it *does* matter as much as your own birthday does to you.

You can think about Christmas as Jesus' birth certificate. It is proof that he really was born and was a real person just like you and me and not a myth. So what happens if his birth certificate gets lost? If we drop the name Christmas and call

it something else like Happy Holidays that looks a lot like identity theft to me. You would be taking away the identity of Christmas but keeping the money-making side of it (and all the fun). Don't let the Identity Theft of Christmas steal away the story of Jesus. Be part of his astonishing story and all that it means. The amazing way he was born, the incredible life he led and most of all its true meaning: he was born of God and by him we are 'put back into a friendly relationship' with God. Merry Christmas!!!
