RECENT CHURCH BOARD DECISIONS_

FINANCE

VOTED: To request the SEC to take £50,000 from the trust fund and use it to pay the HSBC loan. VOTED: To request the SEC to take the funds from the trust fund for the heating and the roof repair/ replacement.

ADULT SABBATH SCHOOL

There are 4 classes currently running: 3 adult and 1 young adult. After Hope channel was switched off, a live panel on the platform was introduced to lead the Scripture-based discussion with the congregation. From this week the adult SS team will install a bookcase to create a library of religious books. Members will be encouraged to bring books to share. There will be some classes in the week on Adventist Identity. Some people want to continue with Zoom classes due to joining from distances. There are different styles of adult classes which should help encourage people to attend church classes. There is only one class (Primary) on Zoom still. That class used to meet in the Oak room. There currently aren't sufficient teachers to restart the class at church. When they do move back, the young adult class will move to another room depending on numbers at the time.

THE SCHOOL OF MUSIC

The school of music has made an application to hold their funds separate from those of the church and run their own accounts. Currently the treasury is a conduit for the students to pay their fees to the college of music, and the music tutors would give invoices to the treasury to pay the tutors from their fees. It would be treated in a similar fashion to ADRA/One Vision/other charitable accounts which don't appear on the profit/loss sheets – a single transfer is made to their account each month and they would have the responsibility for collecting all fees and paying the tutors.

VOTED: For the School of Music to handle their own account.

VOTED: To allow the School of Music to continue autonomously, with an annual report to the business meeting of their activities.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

During the pandemic, the rules did not allow everyone who wished to attend funerals to do so. The pastoral team propose a Memorial service on a Sabbath afternoon at a later date in the year to remember church members, family members and people from the community who died during this time.
